Application Deadline: Friday, November 17, 2023

Purpose:

To award an eligible applicant with a scholarship to help defray the cost of college or other postsecondary education endeavors.

Sponsors:

The event and scholarship are planned and sponsored by the R-H Interracial Clergy Council/ R-H Interfaith League, the Rush-Henrietta Central School District, and the Towns of Henrietta and Rush. Our hope is to embody and spread the Beloved Community envisioned by Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.; we dream, work, collaborate, and celebrate together to create a vibrant unity out of our diversity.

The applicant must:

- a) be a resident of the Rush-Henrietta community.
- b) be a senior in high school with a grade point average of 3.0 (85%) or better.
- c) demonstrate a commitment to the principles of the Rev. Dr. King, Jr. through an original essay, found later in this application.
- d) use the funds awarded to help defray the cost for post-secondary studies.
- e) have documented community service.

Scholarship Amount to be Awarded:

The amount and the number of scholarships depends on the generosity of public donations, made at the annual MLK celebration, and by private contributions. In the past we have been able to award up to \$1,000.

- c) Documented community service
- d) Essay (minimum two pages, double-spaced, 12-point font)

Scholarship will be awarded at the annual Martin Luther King Jr. Celebration scheduled for Thursday, January 11, 2024, at 7:00pm. The location is TBD. Applicants must be present at the celebration to receive the scholarship.
